

SLIPPERY ROCK BOROUGH RECYCLING PROGRAM

MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED AT THIS TIME	WHAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED AT THIS TIME	HOW TO PREPARE MATERIAL FOR RECYCLING
GLASS	Clear, amber and green glass from food jars and beverage bottles	Window glass, light bulbs, crystal, glass tumblers, ceramics	Rinse bottles and jars. Discard lids or caps.
ALUMINUM, STEEL AND BI-METAL CANS	Aluminum, steel or bi-metal food or drink cans; empty aerosol cans & empty paint cans (discard paint can lids)	Aluminum siding, metal toys, lawn furniture	Rinse cans. Crush if space is needed.
PLASTICS (#'s 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7)	Plastic soda bottles, milk and water jugs, liquid detergent, bleach and softener bottles	Bottles from cooking oil, motor oil, cleaning products, freezer containers, anti-freeze bottles, pump or spray bottles, polystyrene (foam) plates, cups & toys	Rinse, discard lids or caps. Crush if space is needed.
PAPER	Newsprint (black/white and colored), glossy magazines, junk mail, cardboard, catalogs, ad flyers, and cardboard	Phone books	Place all paper materials in brown paper grocery bags or bundle and tie. Place all paper materials on top of recycle bin. **

**** If weather is inclement, do not put newspaper or magazines out for collection. We suggest you wait for a better day. If you must put out newspaper in bad weather, place on top of recycle bin and drape weighted plastic over it to keep dry. WET NEWSPRINT CANNOT BE RECYCLED!**

RECYCLING REMINDERS

1. Set out for collection the night before your scheduled day.
2. Rinse recyclables til clean. Discard lids and caps.
3. Place bin within 5-foot of curb or roadside for collection.
4. If you have extra recycling, place in another container with the word "RECYCLING" written on it so that it is clearly visible to driver.
5. Wet newspaper/magazines are not acceptable (see above).
6. Recyclables in plastic bags will not be collected.
7. Recyclables mixed (contaminated) with non-recycle items will not be collected.

BULK CLEAN-UP GUIDELINES

WHITE GOODS Includes ranges, refrigerators, hot water tanks, dish washers, washers, dryers, air conditioners & other items containing refrigerants. All items must be at the curb. There is no charge for disposal during bulk clean-up. Customers may phone our office at any other time of year.

TIRES TIRES WITH RIMS WILL NOT BE COLLECTED! Tires from personal vehicles (pick-up trucks, vans, autos) will be accepted at the curb. There is a limit of four (4) tires per residence.

SCRAP METALS A roll-off box will be placed at the Slippery Rock Community Park for scrap metals (such as auto parts, plumbing pipes). White goods may also be placed in this box.

AUTOMOTIVE BATTERIES We will have a vehicle at Slippery Rock Park on bulk clean-up day for the collection of automotive batteries. There is no charge for this service on clean-up day.

NOTE: Slippery Rock Borough residents requiring bulk collection at other times during the year may contract with Tri-County Industries for pick-up of these items. Items must be prepaid and pre-scheduled. White goods \$35 each, \$15 per item for smaller items-small chairs, toys and other items by weight and size, \$35 per item for larger items- sofas, beds, small furnaces and other items by weight and size.
